

Analysis of Feedback on Curriculum for the Academic Year 2020-2021

Executive Summary

The feedback on the curriculum was sought from multiple stakeholders; teachers, students, alumni, and employers. Key areas that were focused upon included:

- Whether the curriculum is relevant to the course, program, and mental health
- Whether the syllabus and prescribed books are up-to-date
- Whether course outcomes are in place and align to the program outcomes
- Whether evaluation is outcome based
- Whether the curriculum develops necessary professional skills
- Whether the curriculum develops necessary life-skills and soft-skills
- Whether the curriculum prepares the students for employability

The information sought from the different stakeholders differed based on the relevance of the questions to them. Highest amount of information was sought from teachers followed by students since they are the primary stakeholders involved in curriculum delivery and learning. Feedback sought from alumni and employers focused more on the professional and employability skills developed by the curriculum itself.

Overall Analysis

- 1. The curriculum is relevant and contextual to mental health.
- 2. The curriculum develops necessary professional and employability skills
- 3. The curriculum develops necessary soft-skills and life-skills
- 4. The curriculum prepares the students for further studies
- 5. Most of the curriculum is up to date; a few courses may need to be updated
- 6. Most of the reference material prescribed are up-to-date, a few references may need to be updated.

- 7. Course outcomes are in place for all courses; a few course outcomes do not align with program outcomes and this would need to be addressed.
- 8. For some (25%) courses, the time allotted for the completion of the curriculum is not adequate and this would need to be addressed.

Feedback from teachers

Based on the analysis of the feedback from the teachers, the syllabus is relevant and contextual to mental health. About 12% of the teachers feel that the syllabus is not up to date while the remaining 88% believe it is. The books and reference material prescribed in the curriculum are also relevant to the courses. About 12% of the teachers state that the books and reference material prescribed are not up to date while 88% state that they are up to date. While 63% of the teachers feel they have adequate time to complete the syllabus, 37% feel they do not have the needed time. All teachers agree that course outcomes are in place for the courses, and that evaluation is outcome based; 75% state that these outcomes align with the program outcomes. While 75% of the teachers state that course completion develops adequate professional skills, 25% of the teachers feel this is not so.

Feedback from students

Overall, 93% of the students believe that the curriculum is relevant and contextual to the field of mental health. About 89% of the students state that the curriculum prepares them for further studies; 84% state that it equips them for employability; 81% state that it incorporates the necessary professional skills; 88% state that it incorporates the needed soft-skills and life-skills.

Feedback from alumni

About 84% of the alumni from the 2018-2020 batch agree that the curriculum is up-to-date. About 89% state that the curriculum is relevant to their field; 78% state that it develops adequate professional skills; 83% state that it prepares them for work; 80% agree that the learning objectives align to the course.

Feedback from employers

The employers unanimously agree that the curriculum promotes adequate professional skills and provides relevant knowledge for the job. In addition, employers also state that the training at Montfort College ensures healthy attitude among students and that the overall quality of training at Montfort College is excellent. Some of the remarks and observations made by employers include terms such as:

"professional", "sensitive", "approachable", "effective counsellors", "manage multiple responsibilities", "maintain boundaries" "effective during the pandemic", "impressive", "competent", "exemplary".

Action taken based on feedback regarding curriculum

Two members of the teaching faculty are members of the Board of Studies of Bengaluru North University and they mentioned that the curriculum may require some updating and revision at the BOS meeting organized by BNU in October 2021. The chairperson requested that the teachers make note of the needed revisions. He stated that the university would revise the curriculum in line with the National Education Policy of 2020 in a stage wise manner beginning with the UG programs. The college has requested all teachers to submit the suggestions for revision to the IQAC so that the record may be compiled and submitted to BNU when required. The college has also requested teachers to review the course outcomes and program outcomes to ensure that they would be aligned. The college may look into further training for teachers in this area.


Feedback on curriculum was collected from:


- 10 teachers who teach various papers in the college.


Relevance of the Syllabus to the Programs and the Field







Regarding the relevance of the curriculum, 92% of the teachers agree that it is relevant to the course and all (100%) agree that the curriculum is relevant to the program. Among the alumni also, 89% agree that the curriculum is relevant to the program. Teachers unanimously agree that the reference material is also relevant to the course.








Psychology program agree that the curriculum is relevant and contextual to mental health field and program.








How updated the syllabus and the prescribed books are

From the data, we see that 92% of the teachers and 84% of the alumni agree that the curriculum is up to date. 92% of the teachers agree that the reference materials prescribed in the curriculum are up to date.










Presence of course outcomes and their alignment to program outcomes



From the data, we see that all (100%) of the teachers agree that course outcomes are in place, are appropriate, and that evaluation is outcome based. 92% of the teachers agree that he course outcomes align with program outcomes and 80% of the alumni agree that learning objectives align with the course.








Fairness and robustness of evaluation







Development of relevant skills




incorporates the necessary professional skills.







Among the alumni, 78% agree that the curriculum develops adequate professional skills.










Preparation for career

Feedback from the teachers and alumni


Regarding preparation for career, 75% of the teachers agree that the evaluation process gives insights into students' professional competencies as evaluated by the course and 83% of the teachers agree that course completion meaningfully develops adequate professional skills. 83% of the alumni also agree that the curriculum has adequately prepared them for work.





















Among the students, 88% of the 2nd year students of the M.Sc. Counselling Psychology program, 80% of the 2nd year students of the M.Sc. Psychology program, 98% of the 1st year students of the M.Sc. Counselling Psychology program and 82% of the 1st year students of the M.Sc. Psychology program agree that the curriculum prepares them for further studies.





Summary
